
WPA Intelligence conducted two comprehensive surveys for the Baugh for Congress campaign in June 2024. The studies showed that Baugh has a considerable early advantage overall and across the district among multiple key target groups.

Moreover, the political environment in California's 47^{th} Congressional District is particularly strong for Republicans.

Ballot

At present, Baugh has a three-point lead in the two survey average.

- Baugh's lead among "definite" voters is three percent (32-29%).
- Baugh also has strong leads among Hispanics (49-29%), DTS voters (40-35%), men 55+ (48-40%), and women 18-54 (41-36%).

Biden's Impact

Note that even though these surveys were completed prior to the recent Presidential debate, Joe Biden is -10% overall.

His image is also underwater among:

- DTS/Other -13%
- Whites -- 13%, and
- Hispanics -14%

Joe Biden's job approval is just as bad as his image, but especially worse among a key demographic – Hispanics (-26%).

To top it all off, in a district Biden won by 11-points, former President Donald Trump (46%) leads Joe Biden (45%) by one-point in a head-to-head scenario. What should be truly alarming for Democrats is the considerable shift of 2020 Biden voters: 6% are voting for Donald Trump this time around and Biden is only receiving 86% of his 2020 voters.
